In consideration of the premium charged for this Policy, it is hereby understood and agreed that:

- 1. Item 3.A. of the Declarations is amended to add the following:
 - 5. Aggregate sublimit of liability for all **Cyber Extortion Loss** under USD \$1,000,000 **INSURING AGREEMENTS** I.G.:
 - Aggregate sublimit of liability for all Data Protection Loss and Business USD \$1,000,000 Interruption Loss under INSURING AGREEMENTS I.H. and I.I.:
 - 7. First Party Business Interruption Sublimits of Liability:

(1) Hourly sublimit: USD \$250,000 (2) Forensic Expense sublimit: USD \$250,000 (3) Dependent Business Interruption sublimit: USD \$250,000

The above sublimits of liability are part of, and not in addition to, the overall **Policy Aggregate Limit of Liability.**

- 2. Item 3.A.1. of the Declarations is amended to include INSURING AGREEMENTS I.G. (Cyber Extortion), I.H. (First Party Data Protection) and I.I. (First Party Network Business Interruption) within the Policy Aggregate Limit of Liability set forth therein.
- 3. Item 4. of the Declarations is amended to add the following:

- 4. Clause I. INSURING AGREEMENTS, is amended to add the following:
 - G. Cyber Extortion

To indemnify the **Named Insured** for:

Cyber Extortion Loss, in excess of the Retention, incurred by the Insured Organization as a direct result of an Extortion Threat first made against the Insured Organization during the Policy Period by a person, other than the Insured Organization's directors, officers, principals, trustees, governors, Managers, members, management committee members, members of the management board, partners, or any

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person in collusion with any of the foregoing. Coverage under this Insuring Agreement is subject to the applicable conditions and reporting requirements, including those set forth in Clause XXVIII. OBLIGATIONS IN THE EVENT OF AN EXTORTION THREAT.

H. First Party Data Protection

To indemnify the **Named Insured** for:

Data Protection Loss, in excess of the **Retention**, incurred by the **Insured Organization** as a direct result of:

- 1. alteration, corruption, destruction, deletion or damage to a **Data Asset**, or
- 2. inability to access a Data Asset,

that first takes place during the **Policy Period** and is directly caused by a failure of **Computer Security** to prevent a **Security Breach**; provided that such **Security Breach** must take place on or after the **Retroactive Date** and before the end of the **Policy Period**.

I. First Party Network Business Interruption

To indemnify the **Named Insured** for:

Business Interruption Loss, in excess of the applicable Retention, incurred by the Insured Organization during the Period of Restoration or the Extended Interruption Period (if applicable) as a direct result of the actual and necessary interruption or suspension of Computer Systems that first takes place during the Policy Period and is directly caused by a failure of Computer Security to prevent a Security Breach; provided that such Security Breach must first take place on or after the Retroactive Date and before the end of the Policy Period.

5. Clause V. **EXCLUSIONS**, is amended to add the following:

EXT-A With respect to **INSURING AGREEMENTS** I.G., I.H. and I.I.: arising out of or resulting from any criminal, dishonest, fraudulent, or malicious act, error or omission, any **Security Breach**, **Extortion Threat**, or intentional or knowing violation of the law, if committed by any member of the **Control Group** or any person in participation or collusion with any member of the **Control Group**;

EXT-B With respect to **INSURING AGREEMENTS** I.H. and I.I.: Arising out of or resulting from:

- any failure or malfunction of electrical or telecommunications infrastructure or services, provided that this exclusion shall not apply to any otherwise covered Claim or Loss arising out of failure of Computer Security to prevent a Security Breach that was solely caused by a failure or malfunction of telecommunications infrastructure or services under the Insured Organization's direct operational control;
- 2. fire, flood, earthquake, volcanic eruption, explosion, lighting, wind, hail, tidal wave, landslide, act of God or other physical event; or
- 3. any satellite failures;

EXT-C With respect to **INSURING AGREEMENTS** I.G., arising out of or resulting from:

- 1. any threat to physically harm or kidnap any person; or
- 2. any threat to harm, take, or transfer property other than any **Data Asset**, even if such threat is made in conjunction with a threat to a **Data Asset** or by carrying out such threat to, harm, theft, or transfer, a **Data Asset** may be damaged, corrupted, altered, taken, disseminated or transferred;

- EXT–D Arising out of or resulting from any seizure, nationalization, confiscation, or destruction of **Computer Systems** or **Data Assets** by order of any governmental or public authority;
- 6. Clause **VI**. **DEFINITIONS**, paragraphs G., H. and Q. are hereby deleted in their entirety and replaced by:
 - G. Computer Security means software, computer or network hardware devices, the function or purpose of which is to prevent Unauthorized Access or Use, a Denial of Service Attack against Computer Systems, infection of Computer Systems by Malicious Code or transmission of Malicious Code from Computer Systems. Computer Security includes antivirus and intrusion detection software, firewalls and electronic systems that provide access control to Computer Systems through the use of passwords, biometric or similar identification of authorized users. With respect to INSURING AGREEMENTS I.A., I.B., and I.C. only, Computer Security also means the Insured Organization's written information security policies and procedures, the function or purpose of which is to prevent Unauthorized Access or Use, a Denial of Service Attack against Computer Systems, infection of Computer Systems by Malicious Code or transmission of Malicious Code from Computer Systems.
 - H. **Computer Systems** means computers and associated input and output devices, data storage devices, networking equipment, and back up facilities:
 - 1. operated by and either owned by or leased to the **Insured Organization**;
 - 2. operated by a third party service provider and used for the purpose of providing hosted computer application services to the **Insured Organization** or for processing, maintaining, hosting or storing the **Insured Organization**'s electronic data, pursuant to written contract with the **Insured Organization** for such services; and
 - 3. with respect to **INSURING AGREEMENTS** I.I. only, operated by a third party service provider and used for the purpose of providing hosted computer application services to the **Insured Organization** or for processing, maintaining, hosting or storing the **Insured Organization**'s electronic data, pursuant to written contract with the **Insured Organization** for such services, provided such coverage is subject to the sublimit of liability set forth in Item 3.A.6. of the Declarations.
 - Q. Loss means Damages, Claims Expenses, Privacy Breach Response Services, Public Relations Expenses, PCI Fines and Costs, Cyber Extortion Loss, Business Interruption Loss, Data Protection Loss and Penalties.
- 7. Clause VI., **DEFINITIONS**, is amended to add the following:
 - FPC-A Business Interruption Loss means the total of:
 - 1. Income Loss and Extra Expense during the Period of Restoration; and
 - 2. **Extended Income Loss** if the **Income Loss** during the **Period of Restoration** is in excess of the applicable **Retention**.

Provided that **Business Interruption Loss** shall not mean and **INSURING AGREEMENTS** I.H. shall not cover any of the following: **Loss** arising out of any liability to any third party for whatever reason; legal costs or legal expenses of any type; **Loss** incurred as a result of unfavorable business conditions, loss of market or any other consequential loss; or costs or expenses the **Insured Organization** incurs to identify and remove software program errors or vulnerabilities.

All **Business Interruption Loss** resulting from multiple covered interruptions or suspensions of **Computer Systems** that that arise out of the same or a continuing **Security Breach**, from related or repeated **Security Breaches**, or from multiple **Security Breaches** resulting from a failure of **Computer Security** shall be deemed to be a single **Business Interruption Loss**; provided, however, that a separate **Waiting Period** shall apply to each Period of Restoration.

FPC-B Cyber Extortion Loss means:

- any Extortion Payment that has been made under duress by or on behalf of the Insured Organization with the Underwriters' prior written consent, but solely to prevent or terminate an Extortion Threat and in an amount that does not exceed the covered Damages and Claims Expenses that would have been incurred had the Extortion Payment not been paid;
- 2. an otherwise covered **Extortion Payment** that is lost in transit by actual destruction, disappearance or wrongful abstraction while being conveyed by any person authorized by or on behalf of the **Insured Organization** to make such conveyance; and
- 3. fees and expenses paid by or on behalf of the **Insured Organization** for security consultants retained with Underwriter's prior written approval, but solely to prevent or terminate an **Extortion Threat**.

FPC-C Data Protection Loss means:

- with respect to any Data Asset that is altered, corrupted, destroyed, deleted or damaged the actual, reasonable and necessary costs and expenses incurred by the Insured Organization to restore a Data Asset from back-ups or from originals or to gather, assemble and recollect such Data Asset from other sources to the level or condition in which it existed immediately prior to its alteration, corruption, destruction, deletion or damage; or
- 2. with respect to any **Data Asset** that the **Insured Organization** is unable to access, the lesser of the actual, reasonable and necessary costs and expenses incurred by the **Insured Organization** to:
 - (a) regain access to such Data Asset; or
 - (b) restore such **Data Asset** from back-ups or originals or gather, assemble and recollect such **Data Asset** from other sources, to the level or condition in which it existed immediately prior to the **Insured Organization's** inability to access it;

Provided that if such **Data Asset** cannot reasonably be accessed, restored, gathered, assembled or recollected, then **Data Protection Loss** means the actual, reasonable and necessary costs and expenses incurred by the **Insured Organization** to reach this determination.

Provided further that **Data Protection Loss** shall not exceed, and shall not mean, any amount in excess of the amount by which the net profit before income taxes of the **Insured Organization** would have decreased had the **Insured Organization** failed to restore, gather, assemble or recollect as set forth in sub-paragraphs FPC-C.1. and FPC-C.2. above.

A Data Protection Loss will be deemed to occur at the time such alteration, corruption, destruction, deletion or damage to or inability to access a Data Asset is first discovered by the Insured. All Data Protection Loss that arises out of the same or a continuing Security Breach, from related or repeated Security Breaches, or from multiple Security Breaches resulting from a failure of Computer Security shall be deemed to be a single Data Protection Loss.

Data Protection Loss shall not mean, and there shall be no coverage under **INSURING AGREEMENTS** I.G. for:

- costs or expenses incurred by the Insured Organization to identify or remediate software program errors or vulnerabilities or update, replace, restore, gather, assemble, reproduce, recollect or enhance a Data Asset or Computer Systems to a level beyond that which existed prior to the alteration, corruption, destruction, deletion or damage of such Data Asset;
- 2. costs or expenses to research or develop any **Data Asset**, including but not limited to trade secrets or other proprietary information;
- the monetary value of profits, royalties, or lost market share related to a Data Asset, including but not limited to trade secrets or other proprietary information or any other amount pertaining to the value of the Data Asset;
- 4. loss arising out of any liability to any third party for whatever reason; or
- 5. legal costs or legal expenses of any type.
- FPC-D **Dependent Business** means any third party service provider that provides hosted computer application services to the **Insured Organization** or processes, maintains, hosts or stores the **Insured Organization's** electronic data, pursuant to written contract with the **Insured Organization** for such services.
- FPC-E **Extended Income Loss** means the Income Loss during the **Extended Interruption Period**.
- FPC-F **Extended Interruption Period** means the period of time that:
 - 1. begins on the date and time that the **Period of Restoration** ends; and
 - 2. terminates on the date and time the **Insured** restores, or would have restored if the **Insured** had exercised due diligence and dispatch, the net profit before income taxes that would have been earned by the **Insured** directly through its business operations had the actual and necessary interruption or suspension of **Computer Systems** not occurred;

provided that in no event shall the **Extended Interruption Period** mean more than or exceed thirty (30) days.

- FPC-G **Extortion Payment** means cash, marketable goods or services demanded to prevent or terminate an **Extortion Threat**.
- FPC-H Extortion Threat means a threat to breach Computer Security in order to:
 - 1. alter, destroy, damage, delete or corrupt any **Data Asset**;

- prevent access to Computer Systems or a Data Asset, including a Denial of Service Attack or encrypting a Data Asset and withholding the decryption key for such Data Asset:
- perpetrate a theft or misuse of a Data Asset on Computer Systems through external access;
- 4. introduce **Malicious Code** into **Computer Systems** or to third party computers and systems from **Computer Systems**; or
- 5. interrupt or suspend **Computer Systems**;

unless an **Extortion Payment** is received from or on behalf of the **Insured Organization**.

Multiple related or continuing **Extortion Threats** shall be considered a single **Extortion Threat f**or purposes of this Policy and shall be deemed to have occurred at the time of the first such **Extortion Threat**.

FPC-I Extra Expense means:

- reasonable and necessary expenses that are incurred by the Insured Organization during the Period of Restoration to minimize, reduce or avoid an Income Loss, provided:
 - (a) that such expenses are over and above those the **Insured Organization** would have incurred had no interruption or suspension of the **Computer Systems** occurred; and
 - (b) do not exceed the amount by which the **Income Loss** in excess of the **Retention** and covered under this Policy is thereby reduced; and
- 2. **Forensic Expenses**, subject to the sublimit set forth in Item 3.A.7.(2). of the Declarations;

provided that Extra Expense shall not mean, and there shall be no coverage under INSURING AGREEMENTS I.H. for expenses incurred by the Insured to update, upgrade, enhance or replace Computer Systems to a level beyond that which existed prior to the actual and necessary interruption or suspension of Computer Systems; or the costs and expenses incurred by the Insured Organization to restore, reproduce, or regain access to any Data Asset that was altered, corrupted, destroyed, deleted, damaged or rendered inaccessible as a result of the failure of Computer Security to prevent a Security Breach.

FPC-J Forensic Expenses means reasonable and necessary expenses incurred by the Insured Organization to investigate the source or cause of the failure of Computer Security to prevent a Security Breach.

FPC-K Income Loss means:

 the net profit before income taxes that the Insured Organization is prevented from earning through its business operations or the net loss before income taxes that the Insured Organization is unable to avoid through its business operations as a direct result of the actual and necessary interruption or suspension of Computer Systems; and 2. fixed operating expenses incurred by the **Insured Organization** (including payroll), but only to the extent that a. such operating expenses must necessarily continue during **the Period of Restoration** (or **Extended Interruption Period**, if applicable); and b. such expenses would have been incurred by the **Insured Organization** had such interruption or suspension not occurred.

Income Loss shall be reduced to the extent the **Insured** or **Dependent Business** (if applicable) is able, with reasonable dispatch and due diligence, to reduce or limit such interruption or suspension of **Computer Systems** or conduct its business operations by other means.

In determining **Income Loss**, due consideration shall be given to the prior experience of the **Insured Organization's** business operations before the beginning of the **Period of Restoration** and to the probable business operations the **Insured Organization** could have performed had no actual and necessary interruption or suspension occurred as result of a failure of **Computer Security** to prevent a **Security Breach**.

Income Loss will be calculated on an hourly basis based on the **Insured Organization's** net profit (or loss) and fixed operating expenses as set forth above.

FPC-L Period of Restoration means the time period that:

- 1. begins on the specific date and time that the actual and necessary interruption or suspension of **Computer Systems** first occurred; and
- ends on the specific date and time that the actual and necessary interruption or suspension of Computer Systems ends, or would have ended had the Insured or Dependent Business (if applicable) acted with due diligence and dispatch;

provided that in no event shall the **Period of Restoration** mean more than or exceed thirty (30) days; and provided further that restoration of **Computer Systems** will not end the **Period of Restoration** if such systems are actually and necessarily interrupted or suspended again within one hour of such restoration due to the same cause as the original interruption or suspension.

- FPC-M Waiting Period means the period of time beginning when the Period of Restoration begins and expiring after the elapse of the number of hours set forth in Item 4.I. of the Declarations. A Waiting Period shall apply to each Period of Restoration.
- 8. Clause **VII. LIMIT OF LIABILITY AND COVERAGE**, Paragraph A. is amended to include the following prior to the last paragraph thereof:

The sublimit of liability stated in Item 3.A.5. is the aggregate limit of liability payable under this Policy for all **Cyber Extortion Loss** covered under **INSURING AGREEMENTS** I.G. and is part of and not in addition to the Policy Aggregate Limit of Liability stated in Item 3.A.1. of the Declarations.

The sublimit of liability stated in Item 3.A.6. is the aggregate limit of liability payable under this Policy for all **Data Protection Loss** and **Business Interruption Loss** under **INSURING AGREEMENTS** I.H. and I.I. of this Policy and is part of and not in addition to the Policy Aggregate Limit of Liability stated in Item 3.A.1. of the Declarations.

9. Clause **VII**., **LIMIT OF LIABILITY AND COVERAGE**, is modified to add the following at the end thereof:

- G. With respect to **INSURING AGREEMENTS** I.I. (if purchased), the most Underwriters will pay for:
 - 1. covered **Income Loss** per hour is the amount set forth in Item 3.A.7.(1) of the Declarations for Insuring Agreement I.I. as the "**Hourly sublimit**";
 - 2. the **Policy Period** for all covered **Forensic Expenses** is the amount set forth in Item 3.A.7.(2) of the Declarations for **INSURING AGREEMENTS** I.I. as "**Forensic Expense sublimit**"; and
 - 3. the **Policy Period** for all covered **Business Interruption Loss** arising out **Computer Systems** operated by **Dependent Businesses**, is the amount set forth in Item 3.A.7.(3) of the Declarations for **INSURING AGREEMENTS** I.I. as "**Dependent Business Interruption sublimit**".
- 10. Clause VIII. RETENTION, is amended to include the following before paragraph F.:
 - FPC-A. the **Retention** set forth in Item 4.F. of the Declarations applies separately to each **Extortion Threat**. The **Retention** shall be satisfied by monetary payments by the **Named Insured** of covered **Cyber Extortion Loss**.
 - FPC-B. With respect to **INSURING AGREEMENTS** I.H., the **Retention** amount set forth in Item 4.G. of the Declarations applies separately to each **Security Breach**. The **Retention** shall be satisfied by monetary payments by the **Named Insured** of covered **Data Protection Loss**.
 - FPC-C. With respect to **INSURING AGREEMENTS** I.I., the **Retention** set forth in Item 4.H. applies separately to each **Security Breach**. The **Retention** shall be satisfied by covered **Business Interruption Loss** retained by the **Insured Organization**. The **Retention** for **INSURING AGREEMENTS** I.I. shall be as follows:
 - 1. with respect to covered **Income Loss**, the **Retention** shall be the greater of:
 - (a) the **Loss** amount set forth in Item 4.H.(1) of the Declarations, less the amount of any payments within the **Retention** for covered **Loss** under Insuring Agreement I.I. made in accordance with Clause VIII., Retention, Paragraph A.; or
 - (b) the amount of **Income Loss** during the **Waiting Period**; and
 - 2. with respect to **Extra Expense**, the **Retention** shall be USD \$2,500, provided that the **Retention** for **Extra Expense** shall be reduced on a dollar-for-dollar basis (up to USD \$2,500) by the amount of covered **Income Loss** in excess of the applicable **Income Loss Retention**.
- 11. Clause X. NOTICE OF CLAIM, OR CIRCUMSTANCES THAT MIGHT LEAD TO A CLAIM is modified to add the following at the end thereof:
 - E. With respect to **INSURING AGREEMENTS** I.G., in the event of an **Extortion Threat** to which this Policy applies, the **Insured Organization** shall notify Underwriters by contacting the persons specified in Item 9.(a). of the Declarations by telephone immediately upon receipt of any **Extortion Threat**, and shall thereafter also provide written notice by telecopy, email or express mail within five (5) days following the **Extortion Threat**.
 - F. With respect to **INSURING AGREEMENTS** I.H., the **Named Insured** must forward written notice by express mail, email or telecopy to Underwriters through persons named in Item 9.(a). of the Declarations immediately upon discovery of alteration, corruption, destruction, deletion or damage to or inability to access a **Data Asset** to which this

- Insurance applies; provided that all covered **Data Protection Loss** must be discovered and reported (in accordance with Clause **XXVI**. **PROOF OF LOSS AND APPRAISAL**) to Underwriters no later than six (6) months after the end of the **Policy Period**.
- G. With respect to **INSURING AGREEMENT** I.I., the **Insured** shall forward immediately to Underwriters through persons named in Item 9.(a) of the Declarations, written notice of the interruption or suspension of **Computer Systems** to which this Insurance applies in the form of a telecopy, email or express mail. Such notice must be provided during the **Policy Period**, or no later than ten (10) days after the end of the **Policy Period** for interruptions or suspensions occurring within ten (10) days of the end of the **Policy Period**; provided, all covered **Business Interruption Loss** must be reported to Underwriters (in accordance with Clause **XXVI**. **PROOF OF LOSS AND APPRAISAL**) no later than six (6) months after the end of the **Policy Period**.
- 12. The following Clauses **XXVII.**, **XXVIII.**, and **XXVIII.** are added to the Policy:

XXVI. PROOF AND APPRAISAL OF LOSS

- A. **Proof of Loss**. With respect to **INSURING AGREEMENTS** I.H. and I.I., before coverage will apply, the **Named Insured** must:
 - 1. prepare and submit to the persons named in Item 9.(a) of the Declarations a written and detailed proof of loss sworn by an officer of the Named Insured within ninety (90) days after the Insured discovers a Data Protection Loss or the Insured Organization sustains a Business Interruption Loss (as applicable), but in no event later than six (6) months following the end of the Policy Period (unless such period has been extended by Underwriter's written consent). Such proof of loss shall include a narrative with full particulars of such Data Protection Loss or Business Interruption Loss, including, the time, place and cause of the Data Protection Loss or Business Interruption Loss, a detailed calculation of any Data Protection Loss or Business Interruption Loss, the Insured Organization's interest and the interest of all others in the property, the sound value thereof and the amount of Data Protection Loss or Business Interruption Loss or Business Interruption Loss or damage thereto and all other insurance thereon; and
 - 2. upon Underwriters' request, submit to an examination under oath and provide copies of the underlying documents, data and materials that reasonably relate to or are part of the basis of the claim for such **Data Protection Loss** or **Business Interruption Loss**.

The costs and expenses of preparing and submitting a proof of loss, and establishing or proving **Data Protection Loss, Business Interruption Loss** or any other **Loss** under this Policy shall be the **Insured's** obligation, and are not covered under this Policy.

B. Appraisal of Loss. If the Named Insured and Underwriters do not agree on the amount of a Loss, each party shall select and pay an appraiser or other qualified expert (the "Appraiser") to state the amount of the loss or reasonable expenses, and the Appraisers shall choose an umpire. If the Appraisers cannot agree on an umpire, the Named Insured or the Underwriters may request a judge of a court having jurisdiction to make the selection. Each Appraiser shall submit the amount of the Loss or reasonable expenses to the umpire, and agreement by the umpire and at least one of the Appraisers as to the amount of a Loss shall be binding on all Insureds and Underwriters. The Named Insured and Underwriters will equally share the costs of the umpire and any other costs other than the cost of the Appraisers. This provision shall govern only the appraisal of the amount of a Loss, and shall not control the determination of whether

such **Loss** is otherwise covered by the Policy. Underwriters will still retain and do not waive their rights to deny coverage or enforce any obligation under this Policy.

XXVII. RECOVERED PROPERTY

If the **Insured** or Underwriters recover any property, money or **Data Assets** after a loss payment is made, the party making the recovery must give prompt notice of the recovery to the other party. If the recovered property is money or other funds, the recovery shall be applied first to any costs incurred by Underwriters in recovering the property, second to loss payments made by Underwriters, and third to any **Retention** payment made by the **Named Insured**. If property other than money or funds is recovered, then the **Named Insured** may keep the recovered property and return the loss payment, plus the any costs of recovery incurred by Underwriters, or keep the loss payment less the costs of recovery incurred by Underwriters and transfer all rights in the property to Underwriters.

XXVIII. OBLIGATIONS IN THE EVENT OF AN EXTORTION THREAT

A. Insured's Duty of Confidentiality

The **Insured** shall use its best efforts at all times to ensure that knowledge regarding the existence of this insurance for **Cyber Extortion Loss** afforded by this Policy is kept confidential. Underwriters may terminate the insurance provided by this policy for **Cyber Extortion Loss** upon ten (10) days written notice to the **Named Insured** if the existence of insurance for **Cyber Extortion Loss** provided by this Policy becomes public knowledge or is revealed to a person making an **Extortion Threat** through no fault of Underwriters.

B. Insured Organization's Obligation to Investigate Extortion Threat and Avoid or Limit Extortion Payment

Prior to the payment of any **Extortion Payment**, the **Insured Organization** shall make every reasonable effort to determine that the **Extortion Threat** is not a hoax, or otherwise not credible. The **Insured Organization** shall take all steps reasonable and practical to avoid or limit the payment of an **Extortion Payment**.

C. Conditions Precedent

I. INSURING AGREEMENTS

A. Information Security & Privacy Liability

To pay on behalf of the **Insured**:

Damages and Claims Expenses, in excess of the Retention, which the Insured shall become legally obligated to pay because of any Claim, including a Claim for violation of a Privacy Law, first made against any Insured during the Policy Period or Optional Extension Period (if applicable) and reported in writing to the Underwriters during the Policy Period or as otherwise provided in Clause X. of this Policy for:

- 1. theft, loss, or Unauthorized Disclosure of Personally Identifiable Non-Public Information or Third Party Corporate Information that is in the care, custody or control of the Insured Organization, or a third party for whose theft, loss or Unauthorized Disclosure of Personally Identifiable Non-Public Information or Third Party Corporate Information the Insured Organization is legally liable (a third party shall include a Business Associate as defined by the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act ("HIPAA")), provided such theft, loss or Unauthorized Disclosure first takes place on or after the Retroactive Date set forth in Item 6. of the Declarations and before the end of the Policy Period;
- one or more of the following acts or incidents that directly result from a failure of Computer Security to prevent a Security Breach, provided that such act or incident first takes place on or after the Retroactive Date and before the end of the Policy Period;

- (a) the alteration, corruption, destruction, deletion, or damage to a **Data Asset** stored on **Computer Systems**;
- (b) the failure to prevent transmission of **Malicious Code** from **Computer Systems** to **Third Party Computer Systems**; or
- (c) the participation by the Insured Organization's Computer System in a Denial of Service Attack directed against a Third Party Computer System;
- 3. the Insured Organization's failure to timely disclose an incident described in Insuring Agreement I.A.1. or I.A.2. in violation of any Breach Notice Law; provided such incident giving rise to the Insured Organization's obligation under a Breach Notice Law must first take place on or after the Retroactive Date set forth in Item 6. of the Declarations and before the end of the Policy Period;
- 4. failure by the **Insured** to comply with that part of a **Privacy Policy** that specifically:
 - (a) prohibits or restricts the **Insured Organization's** disclosure, sharing or selling of a person's **Personally Identifiable Non-Public Information**;

 - (a) for a computer security expert to determine the existence and cause of any electronic data breach resulting in an actual or reasonably suspected theft, loss or **Unauthorized Disclosure** of **Personally Identifiable Non-Public Information** which may require the **Insured Organization** to comply with a **Breach Notice Law** and to determine the extent to which such information was accessed by an unauthorized person or persons;
 - (b) for a PCI Forensic Investigator that is approved by the PCI Security Standards Council and is retained by the **Insured Organization** in order to comply with the terms of a **Merchant Services Agreement** to investigate the existence and extent of an actual or suspected compromise of credit card data; and in the Underwriters' discretion, where a computer security expert has not been retained under Insuring Agreement I.B.1.(a), for a computer security expert to provide advice and oversight in connection with the investigation conducted by the PCI Forensic Investigator;
 - (c) for fees charged by an attorney to determine the applicability of and actions necessary by the Insured Organization to comply with Breach Notice Law due to an actual or reasonably suspected theft, loss or Unauthorized Disclosure of Personally Identifiable Non-Public Information and to advise the Insured Organization in responding to credit card system operating regulation requirements for any actual or suspected compromise of credit card data that is required to be reported to the Insured Organization's merchant bank under the terms of a Merchant Services Agreement, but this clause does not cover fees incurred in any legal proceeding, arbitration or mediation, or any advice in responding to credit card system operating regulations after any assessment of PCI Fines and Costs; and
 - (d) up to USD 25,000 for a computer security expert to demonstrate the Insured's ability to prevent a future electronic data breach as required by a Merchant Services Agreement;

provided amounts covered by (a), (b), (c) and (d) in this paragraph combined shall not exceed the amount set forth in Item 3.B.2. of the Declarations in the aggregate for the **Policy Period**.

- 2. To provide notification to:
 - (a) individuals who are required to be notified by the **Insured Organization** under the applicable **Breach Notice Law**; and
 - (b) in the Underwriters' discretion, to individuals affected by an incident in which their **Personally Identifiable Non-Public Information** has

been subject to theft, loss, or **Unauthorized Disclosure** in a manner which compromises the security or privacy of such individual by posing a significant risk of financial, reputational or other harm to the individual.

- 3. The offering of Call Center Services to Notified Individuals.
- 4. The offering, at the **Named Insured's** option, of either the **Credit Monitoring Product** or the **Identity Monitoring Product** to **Notified Individuals** residing in the United States whose **Personally Identifiable Non-Public Information** was compromised or reasonably believed to be compromised as a result of theft, loss or **Unauthorized Disclosure**. Such offer will be provided in the notification communication provided pursuant to paragraph I.B.2. above.
- 5. The **Named Insured** will be provided with access to educational and loss control information provided by or on behalf of the Underwriters at no charge.

Privacy Breach Response Services and the conditions applicable thereto are set forth more fully in Clause XXV. of this Policy, Conditions Applicable to Privacy Breach Response Services.

Privacy Breach Response Services will only be provided in excess of the applicable **Retention**, shall not exceed the **Privacy Breach Response Aggregate Limit of Coverage** set forth in Item 3.B. of the Declarations and in Clause VII. of this Policy, and shall not include any internal salary or overhead expenses of the **Insured Organization**.

C. Regulatory Defense and Penalties

To pay on behalf of the **Insured**:

Claims Expenses and Penalties in excess of the Retention, which the Insured shall become legally obligated to pay because of any Claim in the form of a Regulatory Proceeding, first made against any Insured during the Policy Period or Optional Extension Period (if applicable) and reported in writing to the Underwriters during the Policy Period or as otherwise provided in Clause X. of this Policy, resulting from a violation of a Privacy Law and caused by an incident described in Insuring Agreement I.A.1., I.A.2. or I.A.3. that first takes place on or after the Retroactive Date set forth in Item 6. of the Declarations and before the end of the Policy Period.

D. Website Media Content Liability

To pay on behalf of the **Insured**:

Damages and **Claims Expenses**, in excess of the **Retention**, which the **Insured** shall become legally obligated to pay resulting from any **Claim** first made against any **Insured** during the **Policy Period** or **Optional Extension Period** (if applicable) and reported in writing to the Underwriters during the **Policy Period** or as otherwise provided in Clause X. of this Policy for one or more of the following acts first committed on or after the **Retroactive Date** set forth in Item 6. of the Declarations and before the end of the **Policy Period** in the course of **Covered Media Activities**:

- 1. defamation, libel, slander, trade libel, infliction of emotional distress, outrage, outrageous conduct, or other tort related to disparagement or harm to the reputation or character of any person or organization;
- 2. a violation of the rights of privacy of an individual, including false light and public disclosure of private facts;
- 3. invasion or interference with an individual's right of publicity, including commercial appropriation of name, persona, voice or likeness;
- 4. plagiarism, piracy, misappropriation of ideas under implied contract;
- 5. infringement of copyright;
- 6. infringement of domain name, trademark, trade name, trade dress, logo, title, metatag, or slogan, service mark, or service name; or
- 7. improper deep-linking or framing within electronic content.

E. Crisis Management and Public Relations

To pay **Public Relations and Crisis Management Expenses** incurred by the **Insured Organization** resulting from a **Public Relations Event**. Such expenses are subject to the applicable **Retention** and the **Public Relations Event** Limit of Liability. **Public Relations Event** means:

- the publication or imminent publication in a newspaper (or other general circulation print publication) or on radio or television of a covered Claim under this Policy; or
- an incident described in Insuring Agreement I.A.1. or I.A.2. which results in the provision of **Privacy Breach Response Services**, or which reasonably may result in a covered **Claim** under the Policy and which the **Named Insured** has notified the Underwriters as a circumstance under Clause X.C. of this Policy.

Public Relations and Crisis Management Expenses shall mean the following costs agreed in advance by the Underwriters in their reasonable discretion, and which are directly related to mitigating harm to the **Named Insured's** reputation or potential **Loss** covered by the Policy resulting from the covered **Claim** or incident:

- 1. costs incurred by a public relations or crisis management consultant;
- 2. costs for media purchasing or for printing or mailing materials intended to inform the general public about the event;
- costs to provide notifications to customers or patients where such notifications are not required by law ("voluntary notifications"), including notices to non-affected customers or patients of the **Insured Organization**;
- costs to provide government mandated public notices related to breach events (including such notifications required under HIPAA/Health Information Technology for Economic and Clinical Health Act ("HITECH"));
- 5. costs to provide services to restore healthcare records of **Notified Individuals** residing in the United States whose **Personally Identifiable**

Non-Public Information was compromised as a result of theft, loss or **Unauthorized Disclosure**; and

6. other costs approved in advance by the Underwriters.

Public Relations and Crisis Management Expenses must be incurred no later than twelve (12) months following the reporting of such **Claim** or breach event to the Underwriters and, with respect to clauses 1. and 2., within ninety (90) days following the first publication of such **Claim** or breach event.

F. PCI Fines and Costs

To indemnify the **Insured** for **PCI Fines and Costs**, in excess of the **Retention**, which the **Insured** shall become legally obligated to pay because of a **Claim** first made against any **Insured** during the **Policy Period** or **Optional Extension Period** (if applicable) and reported in writing to the Underwriters during the **Policy Period** or as otherwise provided in Clause X. of this Policy. Coverage under this Insuring Agreement is sublimited to the amount set forth Item 3.A.4. of the Declarations, and the Underwriters shall have no duty to defend any **Claim** or pay **Claims Expenses** with respect to any **Claim** under this Insuring Agreement.

II. DEFENSE AND SETTLEMENT OF CLAIMS

- A. The Underwriters shall have the right and duty to defend, subject to all the provisions, terms and conditions of this Policy:
 - 1. any **Claim** against the **Insured** seeking **Damages** which are payable under the terms of this Policy, even if any of the allegations of the **Claim** are groundless, false or fraudulent; or
 - 2. under Insuring Agreement I.C., any **Claim** in the form of a **Regulatory Proceeding**.

Defense Counsel shall be mutually agreed upon between the **Named Insured** and the Underwriters, but in the absence of such agreement, the Underwriters' decision shall be final.

- B. With respect to any **Claim** against the **Insured** seeking **Damages** or **Penalties** which are payable under the terms of this Policy, the Underwriters will pay **Claims Expenses** incurred with their prior written consent. The Limit of Liability available to pay **Damages** and **Penalties** shall be reduced and may be completely exhausted by payment of **Claims Expenses**. **Damages**, **Penalties**, and **Claims Expenses** shall be applied against the Each **Claim Retention** payable by the **Insured**.
- C. If the **Insured** shall refuse to consent to any settlement or compromise recommended by the Underwriters and acceptable to the claimant and elects to contest the **Claim**, the Underwriters' liability for any **Damages**, **Penalties** and **Claims Expenses** shall not exceed
 - the amount for which the Claim could have been settled, less the remaining Retention, plus the Claims Expenses incurred up to the time of such refusal; plus
 - 2. fifty percent (50%) of any **Claims Expenses** incurred after the date such settlement or compromise was recommended to the **Insured** plus fifty percent

(50%) of any **Damages** above the amount for which the **Claim** could have been settled. The remaining fifty percent (50%) of such **Claims Expenses** and **Damages** must be borne by the **Insured** at their own risk and uninsured;

or the applicable Limit of Liability, whichever is less, and the Underwriters shall have the right to withdraw from the further defense thereof by tendering control of said defense to the **Insured**. The portion of any proposed settlement or compromise that requires the **Insured** to cease, limit or refrain from actual or alleged infringing or otherwise injurious activity or is attributable to future royalties or other amounts that are not **Damages** (or **Penalties** for **Claims** covered under Insuring Agreement I.C.) shall not be considered in determining the amount for which a **Claim** could have been settled.

D. The Underwriters agree that the **Insured** may settle any **Claim** where the **Damages** and **Claims Expenses** do not exceed the **Retention**, provided that the entire **Claim** is resolved and the **Insured** obtains a full release on behalf of all the **Insureds** from all claimants.

III. THE INSURED AND THE INSURED ORGANIZATION

As used throughout this Policy, whether expressed in singular or plural, "Insured" shall mean:

- A. The **Named Insured** and any **Subsidiaries** of the **Named Insured** (together the "**Insured Organization**");
- B. A director, officer or **Manager** of the **Insured Organization**, but only with respect to the performance of his or her duties as such on behalf of the **Insured Organization**;
- C. An employee (including a part time or temporary employee) of the **Insured Organization**, but only for work done while acting within the scope of his or her employment and related to the conduct of the **Insured Organization's** business;
- D. A principal if the **Named Insured** is a sole proprietorship, or a partner if the **Named Insured** is a partnership, but only with respect to the performance of his or her duties as such on behalf of the **Insured Organization**;
- E. Any person who previously qualified as an **Insured** under III.B., III.C. or III.D. above prior to the termination of the required relationship with the **Insured Organization**, but only with respect to the performance of his or her duties as such on behalf of the **Insured Organization**;
- F. The estate, heirs, executors, administrators, assigns and legal representatives of any **Insured** in the event of such **Insured**'s death, incapacity, insolvency or bankruptcy, but only to the extent that such **Insured** would otherwise be provided coverage under this Insurance; and
- G. The lawful spouse, including any natural person qualifying as a domestic partner under the provisions of any applicable federal, state, or local law in the United States, of any **Insured**, but solely by reason of any act, error or omission of an **Insured** other than such spouse or domestic partner.

IV. TERRITORY

This Insurance applies to **Claims** made, acts committed, or **Loss** occurring anywhere in the world.

V. EXCLUSIONS

The coverage under this Insurance does not apply to any Claim or Loss;

- A. For, arising out of or resulting from **Bodily Injury** or **Property Damage**;
- B. For, arising out of or resulting from any employer-employee relations, policies, practices, acts or omissions, or any actual or alleged refusal to employ any person, or misconduct with respect to employees, whether such **Claim** is brought by an employee, former employee, applicant for employment, or relative or domestic partner of such person; provided, however, that this exclusion shall not apply to an otherwise covered **Claim** under Insuring Agreement I.A.1., I.A.2., or I.A.3. by a current or former employee of the **Insured Organization**; or to the providing of **Privacy Breach Response Services** involving current or former employees of the **Insured Organization**;
- C. For, arising out of or resulting from any actual or alleged act, error or omission or breach of duty by any director, officer or **Manager** in the discharge of their duty if the **Claim** is brought by the **Named Insured**, a **Subsidiary**, or any principals, directors, officers, **Managers**, stockholders, members or employees of the **Named Insured** or a **Subsidiary** in his or her capacity as such;
- D. For, arising out of or resulting from any contractual liability or obligation, or arising out of or resulting from breach of contract or agreement either oral or written, provided, however, that this exclusion will not apply:
 - only with respect to the coverage provided by Insuring Agreement I.A.1., to any obligation of the Insured Organization to maintain the confidentiality or security of Personally Identifiable Non-Public Information or of Third Party Corporate Information;
 - 2. only with respect to Insuring Agreement I.D.4., for misappropriation of ideas under implied contract; or
 - to the extent the **Insured** would have been liable in the absence of such contract or agreement;
- E. For, arising out of or resulting from any liability or obligation under a **Merchant Services Agreement** except this exclusion does not apply to **PCI Fines and Costs** covered under Insuring Agreement I.F., or to **Breach Response Services** covered under Insuring Agreement I.B.1.;
- F. For, arising out of or resulting from any actual or alleged antitrust violation, restraint of trade, unfair competition, or false or deceptive or misleading advertising or violation of the Sherman Antitrust Act, the Clayton Act, or the Robinson-Patman Act, as amended;
- G. For, arising out of or resulting from any actual or alleged false, deceptive or unfair trade practices; however this exclusion does not apply to:
 - 1. any **Claim** covered under Insuring Agreements I.A.1., I.A.2., I.A.3. or I.C.; or
 - 2. the providing of **Privacy Breach Response Services** covered under Insuring Agreement I.B.,

that results from a theft, loss or **Unauthorized Disclosure** of **Personally Identifiable Non-Public Information** provided that no member of the **Control Group** participated or is alleged to have participated or colluded in such theft, loss or **Unauthorized Disclosure**;

- H. For, arising out of or resulting from:
 - the actual or alleged unlawful collection, acquisition or retention of Personally Identifiable Non-Public Information (except as otherwise covered under Insuring Agreement I.A.5.) or other personal information by, on behalf of, or with the consent or cooperation of the Insured Organization; or the failure to comply with a legal requirement to provide individuals with the ability to assent to or withhold assent (e.g. opt-in or opt-out) from the collection, disclosure or use of Personally Identifiable Non-Public Information; provided, that this exclusion shall not apply to the actual or alleged unlawful collection, acquisition or retention of Personally Identifiable Non-Public Information by a third party committed without the knowledge of the Insured Organization; or
 - the distribution of unsolicited email, direct mail, or facsimiles, wire tapping, audio or video recording, or telemarketing, if such distribution, wire tapping or recording is done by or on behalf of the **Insured Organization**;
- I. For, arising out of or resulting from any act, error, omission, incident, failure of Computer Security, or Security Breach committed or occurring prior to the inception date of this Policy:
 - if any member of the Control Group on or before the Continuity Date knew or could have reasonably foreseen that such act, error or omission, incident, failure of Computer Security, or Security Breach might be expected to be the basis of a Claim or Loss; or
 - in respect of which any **Insured** has given notice of a circumstance, which might lead to a **Claim** or **Loss**, to the insurer of any other policy in force prior to the inception date of this Policy;
- J. For, arising out of or resulting from any related or continuing acts, errors, omissions, incidents or events, where the first such act, error, omission, incident or event was committed or occurred prior to the **Retroactive Date**;
- K. For, arising out of resulting from any of the following:
 - any actual or alleged violation of the Organized Crime Control Act of 1970 (commonly known as Racketeer Influenced and Corrupt Organizations Act or RICO), as amended, or any regulation promulgated thereunder or any similar federal law or legislation, or law or legislation of any state, province or other jurisdiction similar to the foregoing, whether such law is statutory, regulatory or common law;
 - any actual or alleged violation of any securities law, regulation or legislation, including but not limited to the Securities Act of 1933, the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, the Investment Act of 1940, any state or provincial blue sky or securities law, any other federal securities law or legislation, or any other similar law or legislation of any state, province or other jurisdiction,

- or any amendment to the above laws, or any violation of any order, ruling or regulation issued pursuant to the above laws;
- 3. any actual or alleged violation of the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938, the National Labor Relations Act, the Worker Adjustment and Retraining Act of 1988, the Certified Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1985, the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970, any similar law or legislation of any state, province or other jurisdiction, or any amendment to the above law or legislation, or any violation of any order, ruling or regulation issued pursuant to the above laws or legislation; or
- 4. any actual or alleged discrimination of any kind including but not limited to age, color, race, sex, creed, national origin, marital status, sexual preference, disability or pregnancy;

however this exclusion does not apply to any otherwise covered **Claim** under Insuring Agreement I.A.1., I.A.2., or I.A.3., or to providing **Privacy Breach Response Services** covered under Insuring Agreement I.B., that results from a theft, loss or **Unauthorized Disclosure** of **Personally Identifiable Non-Public Information**, provided that no member of the **Control Group** participated, or is alleged to have participated or colluded, in such theft, loss or **Unauthorized Disclosure**;

- L. For, arising out of or resulting from any actual or alleged acts, errors, or omissions related to any of the **Insured Organization's** pension, healthcare, welfare, profit sharing, mutual or investment plans, funds or trusts, including any violation of any provision of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA) or any similar federal law or legislation, or similar law or legislation of any state, province or other jurisdiction, or any amendment to ERISA or any violation of any regulation, ruling or order issued pursuant to ERISA or such similar laws or legislation; however this exclusion does not apply to any otherwise covered **Claim** under Insuring Agreement I.A.1., I.A.2., or I.A.3., or to the providing of **Privacy Breach Response Services** under Insuring Agreement I.B., that results from a theft, loss or **Unauthorized Disclosure** of **Personally Identifiable Non-Public Information**, provided that no member of the **Control Group** participated, or is alleged to have participated or colluded, in such theft, loss or **Unauthorized Disclosure**;
- M. Arising out of or resulting from any criminal, dishonest, fraudulent, or malicious act, error or omission, any intentional **Security Breach**, intentional violation of a **Privacy Policy**, or intentional or knowing violation of the law, if committed by such **Insured**, or by others if the **Insured** colluded or participated in any such conduct or activity; provided this Policy shall apply to **Claims Expenses** incurred in defending any such **Claim** alleging the foregoing until such time as there is a final adjudication, judgment, binding arbitration decision or conviction against the **Insured**, or written admission by the **Insured**, establishing such conduct, or a plea of *nolo contendere* or no contest regarding such conduct, at which time the **Named Insured** shall reimburse the Underwriters for all **Claims Expenses** incurred defending the **Claim** and the Underwriters shall have no further liability for **Claims Expenses**;

provided further, that whenever coverage under this Insurance would be excluded, suspended or lost because of this exclusion relating to acts or violations by any **Insured**, and with respect to which any other **Insured** did not personally commit or personally participate in committing or personally acquiesce in or remain passive

after having personal knowledge thereof, then the Underwriters agree that such insurance as would otherwise be afforded under this Policy shall cover and be paid with respect to those **Insureds** who did not personally commit or personally participate in committing or personally acquiesce in or remain passive after having personal knowledge of one or more of the acts, errors or omissions described in above; however this exception to this exclusion is inapplicable to any **Claim** or circumstance that could reasonably be the basis of a **Claim** against the **Insured Organization** arising from acts, errors or omissions known to any present or former member of the **Control Group**;

- N. For, arising out of or resulting from any actual or alleged:
 - infringement of patent or patent rights or misuse or abuse of patent;
 - infringement of copyright arising from or related to software code or software products other than infringement resulting from a theft or **Unauthorized Access or Use** of software code by a person who is not a **Related Party**;
 - use or misappropriation of any ideas, trade secrets or Third Party Corporate Information (i) by, or on behalf of, the Insured Organization, or (ii) by any other person or entity if such use or misappropriation is done with the knowledge, consent or acquiescence of a member of the Control Group;
 - disclosure, misuse or misappropriation of any ideas, trade secrets or confidential information that came into the possession of any person or entity prior to the date the person or entity became an employee, officer, director, Manager, principal, partner or Subsidiary of the Insured Organization; or
 - 5. under Insuring Agreement I.A.2., theft of or **Unauthorized Disclosure** of a **Data Asset**;
- O. For, in connection with or resulting from a **Claim** brought by or on behalf of the Federal Trade Commission, the Federal Communications Commission, or any other state, federal, local or foreign governmental entity, in such entity's regulatory or official capacity; provided, this exclusion shall not apply to an otherwise covered **Claim** under Insuring Agreement I.C. or to the providing of **Privacy Breach Response Services** under Insuring Agreement I.B. to the extent such services are legally required to comply with a **Breach Notice Law**;
- P. For, arising out of or resulting from a **Claim** by or on behalf of one or more **Insureds** under this Insurance against any other **Insured** or **Insureds** under this Insurance; provided this exclusion shall not apply to an otherwise covered **Claim** under Insuring Agreement I.A.1., I.A.2., or I.A.3. made by a current or former employee of the **Insured Organization**;
- Q. For, arising out of or resulting from:
 - any Claim made by any business enterprise in which any Insured has greater than a fifteen percent (15%) ownership interest or made by any parent company or other entity which owns more than fifteen percent (15%) of the Named Insured; or

- the Insured's activities as a trustee, partner, member, Manager, officer, director or employee of any employee trust, charitable organization, corporation, company or business other than that of the Insured Organization;
- R. For, arising out of or resulting from any of the following: (1) trading losses, trading liabilities or change in value of accounts; any loss, transfer or theft of monies, securities or tangible property of others in the care, custody or control of the **Insured Organization**; (2) the monetary value of any transactions or electronic fund transfers by or on behalf of the **Insured** which is lost, diminished, or damaged during transfer from, into or between accounts; or (3) the value of coupons, price discounts, prizes, awards, or any other valuable consideration given in excess of the total contracted or expected amount;
- S. With respect to Insuring Agreements I.A., I.B., I.C., I.E. and I.F., any **Claim** or **Loss** for, arising out of or resulting from the distribution, exhibition, performance, publication, display or broadcasting of content or material in:
 - broadcasts, by or on behalf of, or with the permission or direction of any Insured, including but not limited to, television, motion picture, cable, satellite television and radio broadcasts;
 - publications, by or on behalf of, or with the permission or direction of any Insured, including, but not limited to, newspaper, newsletter, magazine, book and other literary form, monograph, brochure, directory, screen play, film script, playwright and video publications, and including content displayed on an Internet site; or
 - 3. advertising by or on behalf of any **Insured**;

provided however this exclusion does not apply to the publication, distribution or display of the **Insured Organization's Privacy Policy**;

- T. With respect to Insuring Agreement I.D., any **Claim** or **Loss**:
 - 1. for, arising out of or resulting from the actual or alleged obligation to make licensing fee or royalty payments, including but limited to the amount or timeliness of such payments;
 - for, arising out of or resulting from any costs or expenses incurred or to be incurred by the **Insured** or others for the reprinting, reposting, recall, removal or disposal of any **Media Material** or any other information, content or media, including any media or products containing such **Media Material**, information, content or media;
 - brought by or on behalf of any intellectual property licensing bodies or organizations, including but not limited to, the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers, the Society of European Stage Authors and Composers or Broadcast Music, Inc;
 - for, arising out of or resulting from the actual or alleged inaccurate, inadequate or incomplete description of the price of goods, products or services, cost guarantees, cost representations, or contract price estimates,

- the authenticity of any goods, products or services, or the failure of any goods or services to conform with any represented quality or performance;
- 5. for, arising out of or resulting from any actual or alleged gambling, contest, lottery, promotional game or other game of chance; or
- 6. in connection with a **Claim** made by or on behalf of any independent contractor, joint venturer or venture partner arising out of or resulting from disputes over ownership of rights in **Media Material** or services provided by such independent contractor, joint venturer or venture partner;
- U. Arising out of or resulting from, directly or indirectly occasioned by, happening through or in consequence of: war, invasion, acts of foreign enemies, hostilities (whether war be declared or not), civil war, rebellion, revolution, insurrection, military or usurped power or confiscation or nationalization or requisition or destruction of or damage to property by or under the order of any government or public or local authority;
- V. Either in whole or in part, directly or indirectly arising out of or resulting from or in consequence of, or in any way involving:
 - 1. asbestos, or any materials containing asbestos in whatever form or quantity;
 - the actual, potential, alleged or threatened formation, growth, presence, release or dispersal of any fungi, molds, spores or mycotoxins of any kind; any action taken by any party in response to the actual, potential, alleged or threatened formation, growth, presence, release or dispersal of fungi, molds, spores or mycotoxins of any kind, such action to include investigating, testing for, detection of, monitoring of, treating, remediating or removing such fungi, molds, spores or mycotoxins; and any governmental or regulatory order, requirement, directive, mandate or decree that any party take action in response to the actual, potential, alleged or threatened formation, growth, presence, release or dispersal of fungi, molds, spores or mycotoxins of any kind, such action to include investigating, testing for, detection of, monitoring of, treating, remediating or removing such fungi, molds, spores or mycotoxins;

The Underwriters will have no duty or obligation to defend any **Insured** with respect to any **Claim** or governmental or regulatory order, requirement, directive, mandate or decree which either in whole or in part, directly or indirectly, arises out of or results from or in consequence of, or in any way involves the actual, potential, alleged or threatened formation, growth, presence, release or dispersal of any fungi, molds, spores or mycotoxins of any kind;

- 3. the existence, emission or discharge of any electromagnetic field, electromagnetic radiation or electromagnetism that actually or allegedly affects the health, safety or condition of any person or the environment, or that affects the value, marketability, condition or use of any property; or
- 4. the actual, alleged or threatened discharge, dispersal, release or escape of Pollutants; or any governmental, judicial or regulatory directive or request that the **Insured** or anyone acting under the direction or control of the **Insured** test for, monitor, clean up, remove, contain, treat, detoxify or

neutralize Pollutants. Pollutants means any solid, liquid, gaseous or thermal irritant or contaminant including gas, acids, alkalis, chemicals, heat, smoke, vapor, soot, fumes or waste. Waste includes but is not limited to materials to be recycled, reconditioned or reclaimed.

VI. DEFINITIONS

- A. **Application** means all applications, including any attachments thereto, and all other information and materials submitted by or on behalf of the **Insured** to the Underwriters in connection with the underwriting of this Policy, or prior policies of which this Policy is a renewal thereof.
- B. **Bodily Injury** means physical injury, sickness, disease or death of any person, including any mental anguish or emotional distress resulting therefrom.
- C. Breach Notice Law means any United States federal, state, or territory statute or regulation that requires notice to persons whose Personally Identifiable Non-Public Information was accessed or reasonably may have been accessed by an unauthorized person.

Breach Notice Law also means a foreign statute or regulation that requires notice to persons whose **Personally Identifiable Non-Public Information** was accessed or reasonably may have been accessed by an unauthorized person; provided notification amounts covered under Insuring Agreement I.B.2. as to all such applicable foreign laws or regulations shall not exceed the amount set forth in Item 3.B.3. of the Declarations in the aggregate for the **Policy Period**; provided, (1) such notifications required by foreign laws or regulations shall not count toward the Notification limit set forth in Item 3.B.1. of the Declarations, and (2) neither the **Credit Monitoring Product** nor the **Identity Monitoring Product** provided by Insuring Agreement I.B.4. shall apply to persons notified pursuant to any such foreign statute or regulation.

D. **Call Center Services** means the provision of a call center to answer calls during the hours of 9:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Eastern time (except holidays) for a period of ninety (90) days following notification (or longer if required by applicable law or regulation) of an incident pursuant to Insuring Agreement I.B.2. Such notification shall include a toll free telephone number that connects to the call center during the hours described above. Call center employees will answer questions about the incident from **Notified Individuals** and will provide information required by HITECH media notice or by other applicable law or regulation. **Call Center Services** will only be available for incidents (or reasonably suspected incidents) involving one hundred (100) or more **Notified Individuals** and include up to 10,000 calls per day to the call center.

E. **Claim** means:

- a written demand received by any **Insured** for money or services, including the service of a suit or institution of regulatory or arbitration proceedings;
- with respect to coverage provided under Insuring Agreement I.C. only, institution of a Regulatory Proceeding against any Insured; and
- 3. a written request or agreement to toll or waive a statute of limitations relating to a potential **Claim** described in paragraph 1. above.

Multiple **Claims** arising from the same or a series of related or repeated acts, errors, or omissions, or from any continuing acts, errors, omissions, or from multiple **Security Breaches** arising from a failure of **Computer Security**, shall be considered a single **Claim** for the purposes of this Policy, irrespective of the number of claimants or **Insureds** involved in the **Claim**. All such **Claims** shall be deemed to have been made at the time of the first such **Claim**.

F. **Claims Expenses** means:

- 1. reasonable and necessary fees charged by an attorney designated pursuant to Clause II., Defense and Settlement of Claims, paragraph A.;
- all other legal costs and expenses resulting from the investigation, adjustment, defense and appeal of a Claim, suit, or proceeding arising in connection therewith, or circumstance which might lead to a Claim, if incurred by the Underwriters, or by the Insured with the prior written consent of the Underwriters; and
- 3. the premium cost for appeal bonds for covered judgments or bonds to release property used to secure a legal obligation, if required in any Claim against an Insured; provided the Underwriters shall have no obligation to appeal or to obtain bonds.

Claims Expenses do not include any salary, overhead, or other charges by the **Insured** for any time spent in cooperating in the defense and investigation of any **Claim** or circumstance that might lead to a **Claim** notified under this Policy, or costs to comply with any regulatory orders, settlements or judgments.

- G. Computer Security means software, computer or network hardware devices, as well as the Insured Organization's written information security policies and procedures, the function or purpose of which is to prevent Unauthorized Access or Use, a Denial of Service Attack against Computer Systems, infection of Computer Systems by Malicious Code or transmission of Malicious Code from Computer Systems. Computer Security includes anti-virus and intrusion detection software, firewalls and electronic systems that provide access control to Computer Systems through the use of passwords, biometric or similar identification of authorized users.
- H. **Computer Systems** means computers and associated input and output devices, data storage devices, networking equipment, and back up facilities:
 - 1. operated by and either owned by or leased to the **Insured Organization**; or
 - systems operated by a third party service provider and used for the purpose of providing hosted computer application services to the **Insured Organization** or for processing maintaining, hosting or storing the **Insured Organization's** electronic data, pursuant to written contract with the **Insured Organization** for such services.
- I. **Continuity Date** means (i) the date stated in Item 8. of the Declarations with respect to the **Named Insured** and any **Subsidiaries** acquired before the date stated in Item 8. of the Declarations; (ii) with respect to any **Subsidiaries** acquired after the date stated in Item 8. of the Declarations, the date the **Named Insured** acquired such **Subsidiary**.

- J. **Control Group** means the individuals holding the following positions in the **Insured Organization**: President; members of the Board of Directors; executive officers, including the Chief Executive Officer, Chief Operating Officer, and Chief Financial Officer; General Counsel, staff attorneys employed by the **Insured Organization**; Chief Information Officer; Chief Security Officer; Chief Privacy Officer; **Manager**; and any individual in a substantially similar position as those referenced above, or with substantially similar responsibilities as those referenced above, irrespective of the exact title of such individual and any individual who previously held any of the above referenced positions.
- K. Covered Media Activities means the display of Media Material on the Insured Organization's web site.
- L. **Credit Monitoring Product** means a credit monitoring product that provides daily credit monitoring from the following credit bureaus: Experian, TransUnion and Equifax.

Notified Individuals who subscribe to the **Credit Monitoring Product** shall also receive:

- 1. access to their credit report from one of the three credit bureaus at the time of enrollment;
- 2. ID theft insurance for certain expenses resulting from identity theft;
- notification of a critical change to their credit that may indicate fraud (such as an address change, new credit inquiry, new account opening, posting of negative credit information such as late payments, public record posting, as well as other factors); and
- 4. fraud resolution services if they become victims of identity theft as a result of the incident for which notification is provided pursuant to Insuring Agreement I.B.2.

The **Credit Monitoring Product** will only be available for incidents (or reasonably suspected incidents) involving one hundred (100) or more **Notified Individuals**.

- M. **Data Asset** means any software or electronic data that exists in **Computer Systems** and that is subject to regular back up procedures, including computer programs, applications, account information, customer information, private or personal information, marketing information, financial information and any other information maintained by the **Insured Organization** in its ordinary course of business.
- N. **Damages** means a monetary judgment, award or settlement; provided that the term **Damages** shall not include or mean:
 - future profits, restitution, disgorgement of unjust enrichment or profits by an **Insured**, or the costs of complying with orders granting injunctive or equitable relief;
 - 2. return or offset of fees, charges, or commissions charged by or owed to an **Insured** for goods or services already provided or contracted to be provided;
 - 3. any damages which are a multiple of compensatory damages, fines, taxes or loss of tax benefits, sanctions or penalties;

- 4. punitive or exemplary damages, unless insurable by law in any applicable venue that most favors coverage for such punitive or exemplary damages;
- 5. discounts, coupons, prizes, awards or other incentives offered to the **Insured's** customers or clients;
- 6. liquidated damages to the extent that such damages exceed the amount for which the **Insured** would have been liable in the absence of such liquidated damages agreement;
- 7. fines, costs or other amounts an **Insured** is responsible to pay under a **Merchant Services Agreement**; or
- 8. any amounts for which the **Insured** is not liable, or for which there is no legal recourse against the **Insured**.
- O. **Denial of Service Attack** means an attack intended by the perpetrator to overwhelm the capacity of a **Computer System** by sending an excessive volume of electronic data to such **Computer System** in order to prevent authorized access to such **Computer System**.
- P. Identity Monitoring Product means a product or service that monitors the internet for the possible presence of a Notified Individual's Personally Identifiable Non-Public Information that was compromised or reasonably believed to be compromised as a result of theft, loss or Unauthorized Disclosure in the incident for which such Notified Individual was notified under Insuring Agreement I.B.2.
- Q. Loss means Damages, Claims Expenses, Penalties, Public Relations and Crisis Management Expenses, PCI Fines and Costs and Privacy Breach Response Services.
- R. **Malicious Code** means any virus, Trojan horse, worm or any other similar software program, code or script intentionally designed to insert itself into computer memory or onto a computer disk and spread itself from one computer to another.
- S. **Management Control** means:
 - 1. owning, directly or indirectly, more than fifty percent (50%) of the outstanding securities representing the present right to vote for the election of an entity's directors (in the case of a corporation), members of the board of managers (in the case of a limited liability company), management committee members (in the case of a joint venture or partnership) or persons serving in a functionally equivalent role for such an entity operating or organized outside of the United States; or
 - 2. having the right, pursuant to a written contract or the bylaws, charter, operating agreement or similar documents of an entity to elect, appoint or designate a majority of: the board of directors of a corporation; the management committee of a joint venture or partnership; the management board of a limited liability company; or persons serving in a functionally equivalent role for such an entity operating or organized outside of the United States.
- T. **Manager** means a manager of a limited liability company.

- U. **Media Material** means any information in electronic form, including words, sounds, numbers, images, or graphics and shall include advertising, video, streaming content, web-casting, online forum, bulletin board and chat room content, but does not mean computer software or the actual goods, products or services described, illustrated or displayed in such **Media Material**.
- V. **Merchant Services Agreement** means any agreement between an **Insured** and a financial institution, credit/debit card company, credit/debit card processor or independent service operator enabling an **Insured** to accept credit card, debit card, prepaid card, or other payment cards for payments or donations.
- W. **Named Insured** means the individual, partnership, entity, or corporation designated as such in Item 1. of the Declarations.
- X. **Notified Individual** means an individual person to whom notice is given or attempted to be given under Insuring Agreement I.B.2.; provided any persons notified under a foreign **Breach Notice Law** shall not be considered **Notified Individuals**.
- Y. **Optional Extension Period** means the period of time after the end of the **Policy Period** for reporting **Claims** as provided in Clause IX., Optional Extension Period, of this Policy.
- Z. PCI Fines and Costs means the direct monetary fines and penalties owed by the Insured Organization under the terms of a Merchant Services Agreement, but only where such fines or penalties result both from the Insured Organization's actual or alleged noncompliance with published PCI Data Security Standards and from a data breach caused by an incident (or reasonably suspected incident) described in Insuring Agreement I.A.1. or I.A.2.; provided, PCI Fines and Costs shall not include, any charge backs, interchange fees, discount fees, or other service related fees, rates or charges.

AA. **Penalties** means:

- any civil fine or money penalty payable to a governmental entity that was imposed in a **Regulatory Proceeding** by the Federal Trade Commission, Federal Communications Commission, or any other federal, state, local or foreign governmental entity, in such entity's regulatory or official capacity; the insurability of **Penalties** shall be in accordance with the law in the applicable venue that most favors coverage for such **Penalties**; and
- amounts which the **Insured** is legally obligated to deposit in a fund as equitable relief for the payment of consumer claims due to an adverse judgment or settlement of a **Regulatory Proceeding** (including such amounts required to be paid into a "Consumer Redress Fund"); but and shall not include payments to charitable organizations or disposition of such funds other than for payment of consumer claims for losses caused by an event covered by Insuring Agreements I.A.1., I.A.2. or I.A.3.;

but shall not mean (a) costs to remediate or improve **Computer Systems**, (b) costs to establish, implement, maintain, improve or remediate security or privacy practices, procedures, programs or policies, (c) audit, assessment, compliance or reporting costs, or (d) costs to protect the confidentiality, integrity and/or security of **Personally Identifiable Non-Public Information** from theft, loss or disclosure, even if it is in response to a regulatory proceeding or investigation.

BB. **Personally Identifiable Non-Public Information** means:

- 1. information concerning the individual that constitutes "nonpublic personal information" as defined in the Gramm-Leach Bliley Act of 1999, as amended, and regulations issued pursuant to the Act;
- 2. medical or heath care information concerning the individual, including "protected health information" as defined in the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996, as amended, and regulations issued pursuant to the Act;
- 3. information concerning the individual that is defined as private personal information under statutes enacted to protect such information in foreign countries, for **Claims** subject to the law of such jurisdiction;
- 4. information concerning the individual that is defined as private personal information under a **Breach Notice Law**; or
- 5. the individual's drivers license or state identification number; social security number; unpublished telephone number; and credit, debit or other financial account numbers in combination with associated security codes, access codes, passwords or pins;

if such information allows an individual to be uniquely and reliably identified or contacted or allows access to the individual's financial account or medical record information but does not include publicly available information that is lawfully made available to the general public from government records.

- CC. **Policy Aggregate Limit of Liability** means the aggregate Limit of Liability set forth in Item 3.A.1. of the Declarations. The **Privacy Breach Response Aggregate Limit of Coverage** is separate from and in addition to the **Policy Aggregate Limit of Liability**.
- DD. **Policy Period** means the period of time between the inception date shown in the Declarations and the effective date of termination, expiration or cancellation of this Insurance and specifically excludes any **Optional Extension Period** or any prior policy period or renewal period.
- EE. **Privacy Breach Response Services Aggregate Limit of Coverage** means the Limit of Coverage set forth in Item 3.B. of the Declarations for the provision of **Privacy Breach Response Services**.
- FF. **Privacy Law** means a federal, state or foreign statute or regulation requiring the **Insured Organization** to protect the confidentiality and/or security of **Personally Identifiable Non-Public Information**.
- GG. **Privacy Policy** means the **Insured Organization's** public declaration of its policy for collection, use, disclosure, sharing, dissemination and correction or supplementation of, and access to **Personally Identifiable Non-Public Information**.
- HH. **Property Damage** means physical injury to or destruction of any tangible property, including the loss of use thereof.

- II. **Regulatory Proceeding** means a request for information, civil investigative demand, or civil proceeding commenced by service of a complaint or similar proceeding brought by or on behalf of the Federal Trade Commission, Federal Communications Commission, or any federal, state, local or foreign governmental entity in such entity's regulatory or official capacity in connection with such proceeding.
- JJ. **Retention** means the applicable retention for each Insuring Agreement as specified in Item 4. of the Declarations.
- KK. **Related Party** means the **Insured Organization** and any past, present or future employees, directors, officers, **Managers**, partners or natural person independent contractors of the **Insured Organization**.
- LL. **Retroactive Date** means the date specified in Item 6. of the Declarations.
- MM. **Security Breach** means:
 - Unauthorized Access or Use of Computer Systems, including Unauthorized Access or Use resulting from the theft of a password from a Computer System or from any Insured;
 - a Denial of Service Attack against Computer Systems or Third Party Computer Systems; or
 - infection of Computer Systems by Malicious Code or transmission of Malicious Code from Computer Systems,

whether any of the foregoing is a specifically targeted attack or a generally distributed attack.

A series of continuing **Security Breaches**, related or repeated **Security Breaches**, or multiple **Security Breaches** resulting from a continuing failure of **Computer Security** shall be considered a single **Security Breach** and be deemed to have occurred at the time of the first such **Security Breach**.

- NN. **Subsidiary** means any corporation, limited liability company, joint venture or partnership while the **Named Insured** has **Management Control** over such entity, if the **Named Insured**:
 - 1. had **Management Control** over such entity on the inception date of this Policy or such entity was an insured under a policy issued by the Underwriters of which this Policy is a renewal;
 - acquires Management Control after the inception date of this Policy provided the revenues of the entity do not exceed ten percent (10%) of the Named Insured's annual revenues for the four quarterly periods directly preceding inception of the Policy Period; or
 - acquires Management Control after the inception date of this Policy provided that if the revenues of the entity exceed ten percent (10%) of the Named Insured's annual revenues for the four quarterly periods directly preceding inception of the Policy Period, the provisions of Clause XVI., Mergers and Acquisitions, must be fulfilled;

provided that this Policy only provides coverage for acts, errors, omissions, incidents or events that take place while the **Named Insured** has **Management Control** over such entity.

- OO. **Third Party Computer Systems** means any computer systems that: (1) are not owned, operated or controlled by an **Insured**; and (2) does not include computer systems of a third party on which an **Insured** performs services. Computer systems include associated input and output devices, data storage devices, networking equipment, and back up facilities.
- PP. Third Party Corporate Information means any trade secret, data, design, interpretation, forecast, formula, method, practice, credit or debit card magnetic strip information, process, record, report or other item of information of a third party not insured under this Policy which is not available to the general public and is provided to the Insured subject to a mutually executed written confidentiality agreement or which the Insured Organization is legally required to maintain in confidence; however, Third Party Corporate Information shall not include Personally Identifiable Non-Public Information.
- QQ. **Unauthorized Access or Use** means the gaining of access to or use of **Computer Systems** by an unauthorized person or persons or the use of **Computer Systems** in an unauthorized manner.
- RR. **Unauthorized Disclosure** means the disclosure of (including disclosure resulting from phishing) or access to information in a manner that is not authorized by the **Insured Organization** and is without knowledge of, consent, or acquiescence of any member of the **Control Group**.

VII. LIMIT OF LIABILITY AND COVERAGE

A. The **Policy Aggregate Limit of Liability** stated in Item 3.A.1. of the Declarations is the Underwriters' combined total limit of liability for all **Damages**, **Penalties**, **Public Relations and Crisis Management Expenses**, **PCI Fines and Costs**, and **Claims Expenses** payable under this Policy.

The sublimit of liability stated in Item 3.A.2. of the Declarations is the aggregate sublimit of liability payable under Insuring Agreement I.C. of this Policy and is part of and not in addition to the **Policy Aggregate Limit of Liability** stated in Item 3.A.1. of the Declarations.

The sublimit of liability stated in Item 3.A.3. of the Declarations is the aggregate sublimit of liability payable under Insuring Agreement I.E. of this Policy and is part of and not in addition to the **Policy Aggregate Limit of Liability** stated in Item 3.A.1. of the Declarations.

The sublimit of liability stated in Item 3.A.4. of the Declarations is the aggregate sublimit of liability payable under Insuring Agreement I.F. of this Policy and is part of and not in addition to the **Policy Aggregate Limit of Liability** stated in Item 3.A.1. of the Declarations.

Neither the inclusion of more than one **Insured** under this Policy, nor the making of **Claims** by more than one person or entity shall increase the Limit of Liability.

- B. The Limit of Liability for the **Optional Extension Period** shall be part of and not in addition to the **Policy Aggregate Limit of Liability**.
- C. The Underwriters shall not be obligated to pay any Damages, Penalties, Public Relations and Crisis Management Expenses, PCI Fines and Costs or Claims Expenses, or to undertake or continue defense of any suit or proceeding, after the Policy Aggregate Limit of Liability set forth in the Declarations has been exhausted by payment of Damages, Penalties, Public Relations and Crisis Management Expenses, PCI Fines and Costs or Claims Expenses, or after deposit of the Policy Aggregate Limit of Liability in a court of competent jurisdiction. Upon such payment, the Underwriters shall have the right to withdraw from the further defense of any Claim under this Policy by tendering control of said defense to the Insured.
- D. The **Privacy Breach Response Aggregate Limit of Coverage** stated Item 3.B.1. of the Declarations is the maximum total number of **Notified Individuals** to whom notification will be provided or attempted for all incidents or series of related incidents giving rise to an obligation to provide **Privacy Breach Response Services** covered under Insuring Agreement I.B., and subject to the dollar limitation in section VII.F, below, if applicable.
 - The sublimit of coverage stated in Item 3.B.2. of the Declarations is the aggregate sublimit of coverage for all **Privacy Breach Response Services** incurred and services provided under Insuring Agreement I.B.1. of this Policy.
- E. The Underwriters shall not be obligated to provide **Privacy Breach Response Services**, including any computer security expert costs, attorney's fees, notifications, call center services, credit monitoring, identity monitoring or any other services after the number of **Notified Individuals** under Insuring Agreement I.B.2. reaches an aggregate of the number of **Notified Individuals** stated in Item 3.B.1. of the Declarations. If the total number of individuals to be notified under the Policy exceeds the number of **Notified Individuals** stated in Item 3.B.1. of the Declarations, the **Insured** shall be responsible for providing notification, call center services, credit monitoring services or identity monitoring services to such additional individuals in accordance with Clause XXV. below.
- F. In the event either the **Credit Monitoring Product** or **Identity Monitoring Product** is not commercially available, a similar product will be procured; provided in such event the maximum the Underwriters will pay for the costs of procuring and providing all **Privacy Breach Response Services** under Insuring Agreement I.B., including attorneys fees, expert costs, notification costs including foreign notifications, and substitute products and services for the **Call Center Services**, **Credit Monitoring Product** and **Identity Monitoring Product** shall be no more than an amount equal to the **Policy Aggregate Limit of Liability**, which amount shall be in addition to the **Policy Aggregate Limit of Liability**. In the event there is a change of law, regulation or enforcement that prevents the Underwriters or its service providers from providing all or part of the **Privacy Breach Response Services**, the Underwriters will make reasonable efforts to substitute other services, but if this is not possible, the Underwriters shall not be obligated to provide such services.

VIII. RETENTION

- A. The **Retention** amount set forth in Item 4.A. of the Declarations applies separately to each incident, event or related incidents or events, giving rise to a **Claim**. The **Retention** shall be satisfied by monetary payments by the **Named Insured** of **Damages**, **Claims Expenses**, or **Penalties**.
- B. The **Retention** amount set forth in Item 4.B. of the Declarations applies separately to each incident, event or related incidents or events, giving rise to an obligation to provide **Privacy Breach Response Services**. Under Insuring Agreement I.B.1. and I.B.2., the Each Incident Retention set forth in Item 4.B.1 of the Declarations shall be satisfied by monetary payments by the **Named Insured** of **Privacy Breach Response Services**. Services under Insuring Agreements I.B.3. and I.B.4. will only be provided for incidents requiring notification to more individuals than the number set forth in Item 4.B.2. of the Declarations. For incidents involving fewer individuals, the Underwriters shall not be obligated to offer or provide any services under Insuring Agreement I.B.3. or I.B.4. If an incident requires notice to a number of individuals equal to or greater than the number set forth in Item 4.B.2. of the Declarations, the Underwriters will provide the services set forth in Insuring Agreement I.B.3. and I.B.4. to all **Notified Individuals** subject to the Limit of Liability and other provisions of this Policy.
- C. The **Retention** amount set forth in Item 4.C. of the Declarations applies separately with respect to each **Claim** for one or more of the acts listed in Insuring Agreement I.D. in the course of the **Insured Organization's** performance of any **Covered Media Activities**, including **Claims Expenses**.
- D. The **Retention** amount set forth in Item 4.D. of the Declarations applies separately with respect to each **Public Relations Event**. The **Retention** shall be **satisfied** by monetary payments by the **Named Insured** of **Public Relations and Crisis Management Expenses**.
- E. The **Retention** amount set forth in Item 4.E. of the Declarations applies separately with respect to each **Claim** that gives rise to coverage for **PCI Fines and Costs**. The **Retention** shall be satisfied by monetary payments by the **Named Insured** of **PCI Fines and Costs**.
- F. Satisfaction of the applicable **Retention** is a condition precedent to the payment by the Underwriters of any amounts or providing of any services hereunder, and the Underwriters shall be liable only for the amounts in excess of such **Retention** subject to the Underwriters' total liability not exceeding the **Policy Aggregate Limit**, the **Privacy Breach Response Aggregate Limit of Coverage**. The **Named Insured** shall make direct payments within the **Retention** to appropriate other parties designated by the Underwriters.

IX. OPTIONAL EXTENSION PERIOD

A. In the event of the termination of this Insurance for any reason except the non-payment of premium, the **Named Insured** designated in Item 1. of the Declarations shall have the right, upon payment in full and not proportionally or otherwise in part of the percentage shown in Item 7.(a) of the Declarations of the full premium set forth in Item 5. of the Declarations, to have issued an endorsement providing an **Optional Extension Period** for the period of time set forth in Item 7.(b) of the Declarations

for **Claims** first made against any **Insured** and reported to the Underwriters during the **Optional Extension Period**, and arising out of any act, error or omission committed on or after the **Retroactive Date** and before the end of the **Policy Period**, subject to the conditions set forth herein. In order for the **Named Insured** to invoke the **Optional Extension Period** option, the payment of the additional premium for the **Optional Extension Period** must be paid to the Underwriters within thirty (30) days of the termination of this Insurance. If notice of election of the **Optional Extension Period** and full premium payment is not given to the Underwriters within such thirty (30) day period, there shall be no right to purchase the **Optional Extension Period**.

- B. The Limit of Liability for the **Optional Extension Period** shall be part of, and not in addition to, the applicable Limit of Liability of the Underwriters for the **Policy Period** and the exercise of the **Optional Extension Period** shall not in any way increase the **Policy Aggregate Limit of Liability** or any sublimit of liability. The **Optional Extension Period** does not apply to Insuring Agreement I.B.
- C. The right to the **Optional Extension Period** shall not be available to the **Named Insured** where the Policy premium has not been paid in full, or where cancellation or non-renewal by the Underwriters is due to non-payment of premium or failure of an **Insured** to pay such amounts in excess of the applicable limit of liability or within the amount of the applicable **Retention**.
- D. All notices and premium payments with respect to the **Optional Extension Period** option shall be directed to the Underwriters through the entity named in Item 9.(c) of the Declarations.
- E. At the commencement of the **Optional Extension Period** the entire premium shall be deemed earned, and in the event the **Named Insured** terminates the **Optional Extension Period** for any reason prior to its natural expiration, the Underwriters will not be liable to return any premium paid for the **Optional Extension Period**.

X. NOTICE OF CLAIM, LOSS OR CIRCUMSTANCE THAT MIGHT LEAD TO A CLAIM

- A. If any **Claim** is made against the **Insured**, the **Insured** shall forward as soon as practicable to the Underwriters through persons named in Item 9.(a) of the Declarations written notice of such **Claim** in the form of a telecopy, email or express or certified mail together with every demand, notice, summons or other process received by the **Insured** or the **Insured's** representative. In no event shall such notice to the Underwriters be later than the end of the **Policy Period**, the end of the **Optional Extension Period** (if applicable), or thirty (30) days after the expiration date of the **Policy Period** in the case of **Claims** first made against the **Insured** during the last thirty (30) days of the **Policy Period**.
- B. With respect to Insuring Agreement I.B., for a legal obligation to comply with a **Breach Notice Law** because of an incident (or reasonably suspected incident) described in Insuring Agreement I.A.1. or I.A.2., such incident or reasonably suspected incident must be reported as soon as practicable during the **Policy Period** after discovery by the **Insured**; provided, however, that unless the **Insured** cancels the Policy, or the Underwriters cancel for non-payment of premium, incidents discovered by the **Insured** within sixty (60) days prior to expiration of the Policy shall be reported as soon as practicable, but in no event later than sixty (60) days after the end the **Policy Period**; provided further, that if this Policy is renewed by

the Underwriters and **Privacy Breach Response Services** are provided because of such incident or suspected incident that was discovered by the Insured within sixty (60) days prior to the expiration of the Policy, and first reported during the sixty (60) day post **Policy Period** reporting period, then any subsequent **Claim** arising out of such incident or suspected incident is deemed to have been made during the **Policy Period**.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, if the **Named Insured** reasonably believes that the **Privacy Breach Response Services** provided as a result of such incident or suspected incident are not likely to meet or exceed the **Retention**, then reporting of such incident or suspected incident under this Clause X.B. is at the **Named Insured's** option, but unless such incident or suspected incident is reported in accordance with the first paragraph of this Clause X.B., there shall be no coverage for **Privacy Breach Response Services** in connection with such incident or suspected incident.

- C. If during the **Policy Period**, the **Insured** first becomes aware of any circumstance that could reasonably be the basis for a **Claim** it may give written notice to the Underwriters in the form of a telecopy, email or express or certified mail through persons named in Item 9.(a) of the Declarations as soon as practicable during the **Policy Period**. Such a notice must include:
 - the specific details of the act, error, omission, or Security Breach that could reasonably be the basis for a Claim;
 - the injury or damage which may result or has resulted from the circumstance; and
 - the facts by which the **Insured** first became aware of the act, error, omission or **Security Breach**.

Any subsequent **Claim** made against the **Insured** arising out of such circumstance which is the subject of the written notice will be deemed to have been made at the time written notice complying with the above requirements was first given to the Underwriters.

An incident or reasonably suspected incident reported to Underwriters during the **Policy Period** and in conformance with Clause X.B shall also constitute notice of a circumstance under this Clause X.C.

D. A **Claim** or legal obligation under paragraph A. or B. above shall be considered to be reported to the Underwriters when written notice is first received by the Underwriters in the form of a telecopy, email or express or certified mail or email through persons named in Item 9.(a) of the Declarations of the **Claim** or legal obligation, or of an act, error, or omission, which could reasonably be expected to give rise to a **Claim** if provided in compliance with paragraph C. above.

XI. ASSISTANCE AND COOPERATION

A. The Underwriters shall have the right to make any investigation they deem necessary, and the **Insured** shall cooperate with the Underwriters in all investigations, including investigations regarding the **Application** for and coverage under this Policy. The **Insured** shall execute or cause to be executed all papers and render all assistance

- as is requested by the Underwriters. The **Insured** agrees not to take any action which in any way increases the Underwriters' exposure under this Policy.
- B. Upon the Underwriters' request, the **Insured** shall assist in making settlements, in the conduct of suits and in enforcing any right of contribution or indemnity against any person or organization who may be liable to the **Insured** because of acts, errors or omissions, incidents or events with respect to which insurance is afforded under this Policy; and the **Insured** shall attend hearings and trials and assist in securing and giving evidence and obtaining the attendance of witnesses.
- C. The **Insured** shall not admit liability, make any payment, assume any obligations, incur any expense, enter into any settlement, stipulate to any judgment or award or dispose of any **Claim** without the written consent of the Underwriters, except as specifically provided in Clause II., Defense and Settlement of Claims, paragraph D.
 - Compliance with a **Breach Notice Law** will not be considered as an admission of liability for purposes of this Clause XI.C.
- D. Expenses incurred by the **Insured** in assisting and cooperating with the Underwriters do not constitute **Claims Expenses** under the Policy.

XII. SUBROGATION

If any payment is made under this Policy and there is available to the Underwriters any of the **Insured's** rights of recovery against any other party, then the Underwriters shall maintain all such rights of recovery. The **Insured** shall execute and deliver instruments and papers and do whatever else is necessary to secure such rights. The **Insured** shall do nothing after an incident or event giving rise to a **Claim** or **Loss** to prejudice such rights. Any recoveries shall be applied first to subrogation expenses, second to **Loss** paid by the Underwriters, and lastly to the **Retention**. Any additional amounts recovered shall be paid to the **Named Insured**.

XIII. OTHER INSURANCE

The insurance under this Policy shall apply in excess of any other valid and collectible insurance available to any **Insured**, including any self insured retention or deductible portion thereof unless such other insurance is written only as specific excess insurance over the **Policy Aggregate Limit of Liability** or any other applicable Limit of Liability of this Policy.

XIV. ACTION AGAINST THE UNDERWRITERS

No action shall lie against the Underwriters or the Underwriters' representatives unless and until, as a condition precedent thereto, the **Insured** shall have fully complied with all provisions, terms and conditions of this Insurance and the amount of the **Insured's** obligation to pay shall have been finally determined either by judgment or award against the **Insured** after trial, regulatory proceeding, arbitration or by written agreement of the **Insured**, the claimant, and the Underwriters.

No person or organization shall have the right under this Policy to join the Underwriters as a party to an action or other proceeding against the **Insured** to determine the **Insured's** liability, nor shall the Underwriters be impleaded by the **Insured** or the **Insured's** legal representative.

The **Insured's** bankruptcy or insolvency or of the **Insured's** estate shall not relieve the Underwriters of their obligations nor deprive the Underwriters of their rights or defenses under this Policy.

XV. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

By acceptance of the Policy, all **Insureds** agree that this Policy embodies all agreements between the Underwriters and the **Insured** relating to this Policy. Notice to any agent or knowledge possessed by any agent or by any other person shall not effect a waiver or a change in any part of this Policy or stop the Underwriters from asserting any right under the terms of this Insurance; nor shall the terms of this Insurance be waived or changed, except by endorsement issued to form a part of this Policy signed by the Underwriters.

XVI. MERGERS AND ACQUISITIONS

A. Newly Acquired Subsidiaries

During the **Policy Period**, if the **Named Insured** or any **Subsidiary** acquires another entity whose annual revenues are more than ten percent (10%) of the **Named Insured's** total annual revenues for the four quarterly periods directly preceding inception of the **Policy Period**, such acquired entity shall not be a **Subsidiary**, and no **Insured** shall have coverage under this Policy for any **Claim** or **Loss** that arises out of any act, error omission, incident or event whether committed before or after such acquisition:

- by or on behalf of the acquired entity or any person employed by the acquired entity;
- involving or relating to the assets, liabilities, Covered Media Activities
 or policies or procedures of the acquired entity or to data, information,
 computers, or networks, security systems, of or under the care, custody
 or control of the acquired entity, a Business Associate of the acquired entity,
 or a third party on behalf of the acquired entity; or
- 3. by any person or entity holding, processing, managing or transferring information or operating **Computer Systems** on behalf of the acquired entity;

unless the **Named Insured** gives the Underwriters written notice prior to the acquisition, obtains the Underwriters' written consent to extend coverage to such additional entities, assets, exposures, or **Computer Systems**, and agrees to pay any additional premium required by the Underwriters.

If during the **Policy Period** the **Named Insured** or any **Subsidiary** acquires a privately held entity whose annual revenues are more than ten percent (10%) of the Named Insured's total annual revenues for the four quarterly periods directly preceding inception of the **Policy Period**, then, subject to the **Policy Period** and all other terms and conditions of this Policy, coverage under this Policy shall be afforded for a period of sixty (60) days, but only for any **Claim** that arises out of any act, error or omission first committed or incident or event first occurring after the entity becomes so owned. Coverage beyond such sixty (60) day period shall only be available if the **Named Insured** gives the Underwriters written notice of the acquisition, obtains the written consent of Underwriters to extend coverage beyond such sixty (60) day period to the entity and agrees to pay any additional premium required by Underwriters.

B. Mergers or Consolidations

If during the **Policy Period** the **Named Insured** consolidates or merges with or is acquired by another entity, or sells substantially all of its assets to any other entity, then this Policy shall remain in full force and effect, but only with respect to a **Security Breach**, or other act or incidents that occur prior to the date of the consolidation, merger or acquisition. There shall be no coverage provided by this Policy for any other **Claim** or **Loss** unless the **Named Insured** provides written notice to the Underwriters prior to such consolidation, merger or acquisition, the **Named Insured** has agreed to any additional premium and terms of coverage required by the Underwriters and the Underwriters have issued an endorsement extending coverage under this Policy.

C. All notices and premium payments made under this Clause XVI. shall be directed to the Underwriters through the entity named in Item 9.(c) of the Declarations.

XVII. ASSIGNMENT

The interest hereunder of any **Insured** is not assignable. If the **Insured** shall die or be adjudged incompetent, such insurance shall cover the **Insured's** legal representative as the **Insured** as would be permitted under this Policy.

XVIII.CANCELLATION

- A. This Policy may be cancelled by the **Named Insured**, by surrender thereof to the Underwriters or by mailing or delivering to the Underwriters through the entity named in Item 9.(c) of the Declarations, written notice stating when the cancellation shall be effective.
- B. This Policy may be cancelled by the Underwriters by mailing or delivering to the **Named Insured** at the address shown in the Declarations written notice stating when, not less than sixty (60) days thereafter, such cancellation shall be effective. However, if the Underwriters cancel this Insurance because the **Insured** has failed to pay a premium when due, this Policy may be cancelled by the Underwriters by mailing a written notice of cancellation to the **Named Insured** at the address shown in the Declarations stating when, not less than ten (10) days thereafter, such cancellation shall be effective. Mailing of notice shall be sufficient proof of notice. The time of surrender or the effective date and hour of cancellation stated in the notice shall become the end of the **Policy Period**. Delivery (where permitted by law) of such written notice either by the **Named Insured** or by the Underwriters shall be equivalent of mailing.
- C. If the **Named Insured** cancels this Policy, the Underwriters shall retain the customary short rate portion of the premium hereon. If this Policy is cancelled by the Underwriters pursuant to Clause XVIII.B. above, earned premium shall be computed pro rata.
- D. Premium adjustment may be made either at the time cancellation is effected or as soon as practicable after cancellation becomes effective, but payment or tender of unearned premium is not a condition of cancellation.

E. If the Underwriters decide not to renew this Policy, the Underwriters shall mail or deliver written notice to the **Named Insured** at least sixty (60) days before the end of the **Policy Period**. The notice of nonrenewal shall state the reason for the nonrenewal.

XIX. SINGULAR FORM OF A WORD

Whenever the singular form of a word is used herein, the same shall include the plural when required by context.

XX. HEADINGS

The titles of paragraphs, section, provisions, or endorsements of or to this Policy are intended solely for convenience and reference, and are not deemed in any way to limit or expand the provisions to which they relate and are not part of the Policy.

XXI. REPRESENTATION BY THE INSURED

By acceptance of this Policy, all **Insureds** agree that the statements contained in the **Application** are their agreements and representations, that they shall be deemed material to the risk assumed by the Underwriters, and that this Policy is issued in reliance upon the truth thereof.

XXII. NAMED INSURED AS AGENT

The **Named Insured** shall be considered the agent of all **Insureds**, and shall act on behalf of all **Insureds** with respect to the giving of or receipt of all notices pertaining to this Policy, the acceptance of any endorsements to this Policy, and the **Named Insured** shall be responsible for the payment of all premiums and **Retentions**.

XXIII. VALUATION AND CURRENCY

All premiums, limits, deductibles, **Damages** and other amounts under this Policy are expressed and payable in the currency of the United States. If judgment is rendered, settlement is denominated or another element of **Damages** under this Policy is stated in a currency other than United States dollars or if **Claims Expenses** are paid in a currency other than United States dollars, payment under this Policy shall be made in United States dollars at the rate of exchange published in the *Wall Street Journal* on the date the judgment becomes final or payment of the settlement or other element of **Damages** is due or the date such **Claims Expenses** are paid.

XXIV. AUTHORIZATION

By acceptance of this Policy, the **Insureds** agree that the **Named Insured** will act on their behalf with respect to the giving and receiving of any notice provided for in this Policy, the payment of premiums and the receipt of any return premiums that may become due under this Policy, and the agreement to and acceptance of endorsements.

XXV. CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO PRIVACY BREACH RESPONSE SERVICES

The availability of any coverage under Insuring Agreement I.B. for **Privacy Breach Response Services** (called the "Services" in this Clause) is subject to the following conditions.

In the event of an incident (or reasonably suspected incident) covered by Insuring Agreement I.B. of this Policy, the Underwriters (referred to as "we" or "us" in this Clause) will provide the **Insured Organization** (referred to as "you" in this Clause) with assistance with the Services and with the investigation and notification process as soon as you notify us of an incident or reasonably suspected incident (an "Incident").

A. The Services provided under the Policy have been developed to expedite the investigation and notification process and help ensure that your response to a covered Incident will comply with legal requirements and will be performed economically and efficiently. It is therefore important that in the event of an Incident, you follow the program's requirements stated below, as well as any further procedures described in the *Policy Holder Information Packet* ("*Information Packet*") provided with this Policy, and that you communicate with us so that we can assist you with handling the Incident and with the Services. You must also assist us and cooperate with us and any third parties involved in providing the Services. In addition to the requirements stated below, such assistance and cooperation shall include, without limitation, responding to requests and inquiries in a timely manner and entering into third party contracts required for provision of the Services.

The *Information Packet* lists the approved providers of the Services along with additional information and procedures about the **Privacy Breach Response Services** provided under the Policy, and the *Information Packet* may be updated from time to time. Because the *Information Packet* is subject to change at any time, the information, procedures and service provider lists applicable to a specific Incident covered under the Policy will be those in the then current *Information Packet*, which you can request from us at the time of an Incident.

- B. After notifying us of an Incident, you will be contacted by a member of our dedicated Breach Response Services team. Our team will provide you with information to help you respond to the Incident, assist you in engaging service providers, answer questions you may have about the process, and provide you with assistance throughout the breach response process.
- C. If the costs of a computer security expert are covered under Insuring Agreements I.B.1.(a) or I.B.1.(b), you must select such expert, in consultation with us, from the program's list of approved computer security experts included in the *Information Packet* provided with this Policy, which list may be updated by us from time to time. The computer security expert will require access to information, files and systems and you must comply with the expert's requests and cooperate with the expert's investigation. Reports or findings of the expert will be made available to you, us and any attorney that is retained to provide advice to you with regard to the Incident.
- D. If the costs of an attorney are covered under Insuring Agreement I.B.1., such attorney shall be selected by you from the program's list of approved legal counsel included in the *Information Packet* provided with this Policy, which list may be updated by us from time to time. The attorney will represent you in determining the applicability of, and the actions necessary to comply with, **Breach Notice Laws** in connection with the Incident and to advise regarding credit card system operating regulation requirements under Insuring Agreement I.B.1.(c), if applicable.

- E. If notification to individuals in connection with an Incident is covered under Insuring Agreement I.B.2., such notice will be accomplished through a mailing, email, or other method if allowed by statute and if it is more economical to do so (though we will not provide notice by publication unless you and we agree or it is specifically required by law), and will be performed by a service provider selected by us from the program's list of approved breach notification service providers included in the *Information Packet* provided with this Policy, which list may be updated by us from time to time. The selected breach notification service provider will work with you to provide the required notifications. As part of this process, you will need to provide the following information:
 - 1. A notification letter must be prepared. Our Breach Response Services Group will be able to provide you with templates and assist you with the preparation process. Final form and content of the notification letter is to be prepared in consultation with legal counsel and approved by us. It is important for this letter to be prepared without delay and for you to promptly provide sign off for the final proof of the letter provided to you for review prior to copying and mailing. The notification letter will be in black and white on two sided paper.
 - 2. You will provide the list of names and addresses of the persons to be notified to the notification service provider in a spreadsheet or other agreed format as specified by the breach notification service provider. This list will be updated by the breach notification service provider through use of the United States Postal Service® ("USPS") database of address changes, and notifications will be provided to the most recent address on the USPS database. Any returned mail will be collected and provided to you at your request, but the Services do not include any further tracing of individuals whose letter was returned by the USPS. Mailing of notification letters will be staggered if needed to take into account call center resources.

Our staff will assist you with the notification process, but it is important that you timely respond to requests, approve letter drafts, and provide address lists and other information as required to provide the Services. It will be your responsibility to pay any costs caused by your delay in providing information or approvals necessary to provide the Services, mistakes in information you provide, changes to the letter after approval, or any other failure to follow the notification procedure if it increases the cost of providing the Services in connection with an Incident.

- F. If **Call Center Services** are offered under Insuring Agreement I.B.3., such services shall be performed by a service provider selected by us who will work with you to provide the **Call Center Services** as described in Clause VI.D. above.
- G. If either a **Credit Monitoring Product** or an **Identity Monitoring Product** is offered under Insuring Agreement I.B.4., such product shall be provided by a service provider selected by us.
- H. In the event that one or more Incidents covered by the Policy aggregate to more than the number of notifications stated in Item 3.B.1. of the Declarations, you will be responsible for paying for **Privacy Breach Response Services** with respect to the excess notifications, and such costs will not be covered by the Policy. In the event of an Incident involving notifications both within the notification limit stated in Item 3.B.1. of the Declarations and in excess of the notification limit stated in Item 3.B.1

of the Declarations, you agree that notification to all individuals to be notified will be provided by our breach notification service provider, and the costs will be allocated between us pro-rata based on the number of covered and non-covered notifications. The non-covered notifications will be selected randomly from the list of persons to be notified, and you agree to be responsible for any costs incurred in connection with non-covered notifications, including but not limited to the costs of any credit monitoring product, identity monitoring product and call center services that may be offered in the non-covered notifications.
